Important information about the yellow sack

Sales packaging

» All empty sales packaging that has been "scraped clean", except glass and paper, belongs in the yellow sack.

Only use yellow sacks

- » Only put out original yellow sacks (or yellow bins) that have been correctly filled for collection. Bags of a different colour, opaque or incorrectly filled bags will not be collected. Once they have been re-sorted, they can be made available again for the next collection, or they can be dropped off independently at the recycling centres.
- » At the turn of the year, a basic supply of yellow sacks is distributed to all households in Ulm. The collection of one roll of yellow sacks per household per time is available all year round at the EBU service center, at the service centres/ local administrations of the city of Ulm and at the recycling centres. Workplaces/(commercial) businesses can obtain larger quantities directly from REMONDIS Süd GmbH, Voithstr. 5. No distribution to households!

Put out for collection in correct manner

- » Yellow sacks should be placed on the pavement/ outer roadside of your own property at least one day before collection, from 1:00 pm on. Yellow sacks that are put out too early are an administrative offence and will be punished with a fine.
- » Outside of the collection dates, you can drop off yellow sacks at the recycling centres.

Yellow sack – What can you put in it and what not?

YES! This belongs in the yellow sack:

Used and empty packaging made of plastic, synthetic materials, composites or aluminium, metal, tin plate

It is not necessary to rinse the packaging: "scraped clean" and without any residues is sufficient.

Packaging made from plastics

e.g., cups, bags, bottles, films, tubes, bags, polystyrene packaging, ...

Packaging made of composite materials

e.g., beverage cartons, milk/juice cartons, Tetra Paks, blister packs for tablets or similar, vacuum packs,



Tip for improving the recycling rate!

e.g., aluminium foil, aluminium packaging, tins,

ready-meal bowls, crown caps, ...

Remove or unscrew (foil) lids, stickers/labels and caps. Separate packaging components from one another facilitates (mechanical) sorting in the sorting plant and thus the recycling of the material.

NO! This does not belong in the yellow sack:



- » Old clothes/shoes
- » Baby bottles
- » Batteries/rechargeable batteries
- » CDs/disks
- » Women's tights
- » Printer cartridges
- » DVDs, films
- » Electrical appliances, cables
- » Food leftovers, organic waste
- » Bicycle tubes or tyres
- » Paint buckets with paint residues
- » Lighters
- » Glass
- (e.g., glass bottles)
- » Light bulbs/LEDs
- » Wood shavings
- » Hygiene articles/ nappies
- » Ceramics/porcelain
- » Children's toys

- » Transparent sleeves, foils
- » Ballpoint pens, felt pens
- » Air mattresses/ mattress pads
- » Medicines
- » Mouth protection, disposablegloves
- » Files/Folders
- » Paper/Cardboard/ Carton
- » Plasters, bandaging material
- » Residual waste
- » Syringes, infusion bags
- » Styrofoam/pieces (no packaging material, e.g., insulation panels)
- » Wallpaper scrapings
- » (Video) cassettes
- Toothbrushes, disposablerazors
- » Tents, rubber rafts
- » Cigarette butts

Attention!

Plastic and metal waste that is not packaging

(e.g., laundry baskets, cleaning buckets, Tupperware, cleaning sponges, etc.) belong in the residual waste container or at the recycling centre.

Not everything that is made of plastic belongs in the yellow sack!

Glass belongs in the bottle bank or must go to the recycling centre.

Packaging made from paper, cardboard or carton belong in the blue bin, in the club collection or must go to the recycling centre.
